### **Factors of Success**

- 1. <u>Attitude</u> If you come to school with a positive frame of mind about yourself and your school it will shape how you feel, act, and how other interact with you. There is always something good or positive to focus on. Your attitude is your choice!
- 2. Attendance You must be consistent in your attendance and you must be on time. Students who accumulate as few as five absences in class experience a decrease in grades, learning and achievement. If you are not here you cannot learn.
- 3. **Work Ethic** A strong work ethic means that you do all of the work asked of you, that you do that work to the best of your ability, and that you turn your work in on time. If you do not understand a concept or an assignment then it is important to ask for direction or help.
- 4. <u>Perseverance</u> Perseverance means to not give up. It means to try harder when something becomes more difficult. The rigorous standards of high school will most certainly require student to develop their ability to persevere.
